FROM APPLICATION TO ASSIGNMENT

1 – REGIONAL INTERVENTIONS FOR THE DSU OF THE ESU OF VENICE

The interventions for the DSU are regulated by Regional Law 8/1998, by the Prime Ministerial Decree of 9 April 2001, by Legislative Decree no. 68/2012, by Ministerial Decree 1320/2021 and by the **Annual Regional Plan of interventions for the implementation of the Right to University Education** (DGRV no. 774/2025 for the Academic Year 2025-26, pending the adoption of the DGRV for the Academic Year 2026-27).

With this Notice, the ESU of Venice regulates the regional interventions for the DSU, aimed at achieving full integration of students into the university environment and promoting the achievement of the academic objectives of the Venetian universities at **CA' FOSCARI and IUAV**: for students enrolled at the **Academy of Fine Arts and the Conservatory of Music**, ESU issues a specific notice dedicated to them.

Meals are paid for according to the "meal bracket" assigned based on the student's requirements and any scholarship award.

The regional DGR – DSU annually regulates the canteen bands provided for

• ALL: for GENERAL UNIVERSITY STUDENTS based on the year of enrollment

(first year, subsequent years, out of course, part-time) and based on merit and income requirements.

• SCHOLARSHIP HOLDERS: for those applying for a SCHOLARSHIP, the price will be adjusted based on their status WINNER or EXCLUDED DUE TO LACK OF FUNDS, the status IN OFFICE, COMMUTER, OUT OF OFFICE

• OTHER USERS who can access the service (teachers, scholars, staff

administrative staff, private companies that operate at ESU or universities affiliated with ESU) can access the service by prior agreement or arrangement. These users access the service at prices that do not involve any costs for ESU.

Validity of canteen brackets: the time period that normally coincides with the calendar year, not the academic year, and in any case with the possession of the status on the basis of which it was defined.

2 - REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE CALL FOR TENDERS

The benefit is granted **only** for the achievement of the **first qualification for each level of study** to students enrolled at a **Venetian university**.

To participate in the ESU Accommodation Competition, students must meet the following requirements:

be regularly enrolled in the 2026/2027 academic year

1. be "OUT OF RESIDENT" (or "COMMUTER" limited to the specific VENETO COMMUTER RESERVE)

3. meet the income and/or merit requirements set out in the Call for Applications which vary according to of the year of registration:

ENROLLED in the FIRST YEARS:

INCOME requirements ONLY

REGISTERED for FOLLOWING YEARS:

MERIT and INCOME requirements

2.1 REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE Academic Year 2026/2027

The student self-certifies enrollment under his or her own responsibility, which is subsequently verified by the office during the practical examination.

Any previous studies that ended with a **withdrawal from studies** do not affect participation in the competition, provided that the student did not benefit from subsidized accommodation and/or a scholarship during those studies.

Any **credits** acquired during the previous enrollment will not be counted as a merit requirement for the new course of study.

The accommodation benefit can only be granted for the first time at each of the following course levels:

Bachelor's Degree	8 semesters
Master's Degree/Master's Degree 6 semesters	
PhD	Period equal to the legal duration of the courses
Specialization Schools	Period equal to the legal duration of the courses

2.2 "OFF-SITE" (FS) and "COMMUTER" (P) REQUIREMENT

The student who resides in municipalities which, with respect to the university site,

- are at least 80 km away and/or require travel times of more than 80 minutes from the residence are considered "OUT OF RESIDENCE" (FS)
- are between 40 and 80 km away and/or require travel times between 40 and 80 minutes from the residence and are considered "COMMUTERS" (P)

The Veneto Region has prepared a study to identify the Municipalities considered Out of

Headquarters, Commuters and On-site with respect to each university location to which they refer, in addition to

ESU, IUAV, and Ca' Foscari University for the management of regional scholarships reserved for their members, available at the link: <https://www-archive.iuav.it/studenti/quanto-si-/Diritto-al/Borse-di-s/Fuori-Sede/Classifica/index.htm>

The applicant self-certifies their OUT-OF-RESIDENT status under their own responsibility (the offices will verify this during the application process). Applicants who believe the FS/P status assigned based on the regional study does not objectively correspond to their actual situation may document their situation and request a review of their status.

Students **with disabilities** can participate in the competition by submitting a request for accommodation services regardless of their residence.

2.3 STUDENT PLACES RESERVED AT TREVISO, VICENZA AND PADUA LOCATIONS

For Ca' Foscari students attending courses in TREVISO, ESU Venice guarantees 8 beds in apartments affiliated with Ater Treviso.

IUAV students attending courses in VICENZA are participating in this competition issued by ESU Venice but will be able to benefit from the service once ESU Venice, in collaboration with ESU Padua, activates the on-site service during the academic year.

Students from the University of Padua attending courses in Venice are eligible to apply for admission to the competition announced by ESU Padova.

2.5 "COMMUTER" RESERVE OF VENETO (P)

A reserve of places is provided for **commuter students from Veneto** who meet the **merit and/or income requirements** set out in the competition announcement, up to a **maximum of 10% of the available places**.

The **final** assignment to these users is conditional, without exception, on the availability of places following the assignment to eligible OUT-OF-RESIDENT students.

In general, they will be able to use the service **from November 1, 2026**.

3 - REASONS FOR EXCLUSION AND SPECIAL CASES FOR GRADUATES

They are excluded from the competition

1. Part-time students
2. Already housed in ESU, recipients of a WARNING according to the housing regulations
3. Already in possession of a qualification equivalent to the new registration, even if obtained abroad

3.1 PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student (PT) is someone who, for reasons of work, health, or caring for dependent family members, is unable to pursue full-time studies. They have the option of spreading out their studies and earning the related credits over time. At the same time, specific regulations apply regarding the provision of regional benefits, including:

Stock exchange of Studio	An amount equal to half that of full-time students; the scholarship is paid entirely in cash (excluding meals and accommodation fees). PT students participate in scholarship competitions for twice the number of academic years as full-time students.
Service Accommodation	is excluded from the competition ; can access the housing service only once the rankings of those eligible have been exhausted, at Tariff E - Extra Competition
Service Mensa	access the canteen service at full cost

3.2 WARNING

These are students who have already been assigned accommodation and have been warned for violating the rules included in the Regulations for Access to the Housing Service of the ESU of Venice, namely:

- 1) have been subjected to a disciplinary measure of "forfeiture" of the benefit;
- 2) are not up to date with accommodation fees payments from the previous academic year;
- 3) have incurred the sanctions provided for by law as a result of false self-certifications.

3.3 STUDENTS WHO HAVE ALREADY OBTAINED A QUALIFICATION CORRESPONDING TO THE NEW ENROLLMENT

Regional benefits are granted for the first time at each level of courses, wherever the first qualification was obtained.

Applicants who have already been enrolled and subsequently withdrew from their studies are NOT ADMITTED to the COMPETITION if they have already participated in the competition in their previous career, for the same year and course level as the new enrollment, resulting in them being a BENEFICIARY (scholarship winner, eligible or excluded, or assigned accommodation).

Each participant in the competition is required to promptly notify the ESU of Venice of any event relevant to the competition and, in particular, to the provision or revocation of regional benefits.

3.4 SPECIAL CASE - DEGREE IN THE EXTRAORDINARY SESSION AY 2025/2026

1. Students intending **to graduate in the extraordinary sessions¹ of the 2025/2026 academic year**, scheduled for late 2026 - early 2027, who avail themselves of the option offered by the Universities **not to enroll in the 2026/2027 academic year, cannot, however, participate** in the competition to request regional benefits.

2. If you enroll in the **2026/2027 academic year, you can regularly participate in the competition.**

In this case, if the degree is obtained **in the extraordinary session, the benefits will be lost.**

Any DSU received (accommodation and catering services) during the 2026/2027 academic year and, therefore, must be returned/refunded.

3.5 SPECIAL CASE - DEGREE IN THE ORDINARY AUTUMN SESSION AY 2025/2026

1. If **you are NOT enrolling in the 2026/2027 academic year** because you graduate in the **2026 ordinary autumn session** (October-November-December), **cannot participate in the ESU competition to request regional benefits** (accommodation service), may eventually submit a request for the accommodation service through the dedicated procedure of the NOTICE "EXTRA COMPETITION", published on the website at the page www.esuvenezia.it/servizi/servizio_abitativo/extraconcorso

2. If **you enroll in the 2026/2027 academic year** and intend to graduate by the **2026 fall graduation period** (October-November-December), **you can participate in the ESU competition to request regional benefits** (housing).

¹ The extraordinary sessions are graduation windows foreseen by the academic calendars of the Universities located approximately between winter and spring

4.1 – CRITERIA FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF BED PLACES IN COMPETITION

The reserves envisaged by the DGRV DSU are the following:

- **70% YEARS AFTER THE FIRST (BACHELOR'S or MASTER'S DEGREE)**
- **30% FIRST YEAR OF EACH LEVEL (BACHELOR'S or MASTER'S) of which**
 - **80%** to members of the European Union (EU)
 - **20%** for non-EU citizens

4.2 - OTHER RESERVES

INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY

As per agreements signed with the Universities and AFAMs, places are reserved for students attending international mobility exchange programs.

VENETO COMMUTING STUDENT

A reserve of accommodations is provided for commuter students from Veneto who meet the merit and/or income requirements set out in the competition announcement, up to a maximum of 10% of the available places. The final assignment of these students is conditional on:

Ultimately, based on the availability of places following the assignment to eligible non-resident students. Generally, they will be able to use the service starting November 1, 2026.

4.3 - EXTRAORDINARY ACCOMMODATION ALLOCATION

Pursuant to **Regional Law 8/1998**, the ESU may assign any remaining places on an extraordinary basis to students with a "NOT ELIGIBLE" rating who request extraordinary assignment and meet specific requirements. After evaluating the requests received, the Benefits Office draws up a specific ranking, based on which any available "Extraordinary Assignment" places are assigned.

4.4 – EXTRA-COMPETITION ASSIGNEES

If, once the allocations referred to in the previous points have been exhausted, accommodation spaces remain, or if spaces become available during the academic year, it is possible to access the accommodation service even if you do not meet the requirements set by the competition.

This category of places is assigned based on a specific COMPETITION NOTICE issued annually by ESU Venice by June:

Places are assigned on a "one-stop" basis to meet the following types of users in order of priority: TYPE 1) Students who are "not eligible" for the ESU Call: to guarantee housing solutions to those who have not obtained a place through the annual competition for the regional accommodation service (hereinafter the ESU Call) and who submit a specific request on the portal between the publication of the final ranking of the competition and 31.10.26.

TYPE 2) Flexible User (Full or Partial Year): for students who do not meet the requirements set out in the ESU Call and/or who do not participate in it and who submit a specific request from 06.15.2026 to 04.30.2027, committing to use the accommodation for a minimum period of three months.

Applicants who are EXTRA COMPETITION students are not subject to the competition rules, except for the 20% limit of places that can be assigned to NON-EU students enrolled in the first year of a three-year or master's degree (out of 30% of the places reserved for first-year students) as specifically provided for by regional regulations.

The accommodation is assigned at the "Tariff E - EXTRA-COMPETITION" rate, calculated annually so that it does not entail costs for the Company as required by LR 8/98.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

Part-time students enrolled in Bachelor's and Master's degree courses can access the housing service, once the rankings of those eligible have been exhausted, at the "Tariff E - EXTRA-CONCORSO".

5 – HOW TO SUBMIT THE APPLICATION

The application for access to regional benefits provided through a competition by ESU Venezia is made through **SOL (Online Help Desk DSU ESU)** accessible from the home page of www.esuvenezia.it



To access, the applicant must use SPID or CIE

ITALIAN CITIZENS: Access via SPID/CIE

SPID allows **Italian citizens** access to all online portals of the public administration and participating private individuals.

Those who access with SPID/CIE **do not** need to download and sign the online application, as the SPID/CIE certifies the identity of the applicant.

NON-ITALIAN CITIZENS: "ACCREDITATION" Procedure

Non-Italian applicants must access the portal by registering directly on the website, in the section called "ACCREDITATION".

Once you have registered, access it via the "LOGIN WITH ESU CREDENTIALS" button by entering your email and password to access the SOL PORTAL.

5.1 – ITALIAN APPLICANTS

To complete the online application to participate in the competition, the student must have:

- tax code
- an email address (student only)
- matriculation number/pre-matriculation number, or you can temporarily enter the generic code "000000". It will be your responsibility to provide the correct one as soon as possible.
- ISEE/ISPE calculation for the purposes of the updated DSU issued by an authorised CAF
- for years after the first: list of credits and weighted average of grades, updated as of 08/10/2026.

5.2 – NON-ITALIAN APPLICANTS

Non-EU students are considered OUT-OF-RESIDENT students for the purposes of accessing accommodation, except if the student's family unit resides in Italy.

Foreign applicants who do not have SPID/CIE can access the site via the "LOGIN WITH ESU CREDENTIALS" section after completing "ACCREDITATION".

5.2.1 – NON-ITALIAN APPLICANTS FROM OUTSIDE THE EU

*) ATTENTION: Non-EU applicants from countries in conflict are not required to submit the ISEE Parificato but a replacement certification: with the imminent approval of the DGRV (Annual Regional Plan of Interventions for the Implementation of the Right to University Education for the Academic Year 2026-27), all the relevant details will be provided to those interested.

5.3 – CHECKS ON THE TRUTHFULNESS OF DECLARATIONS

Competition applications, as well as the DSU to obtain the ISEE certification, are submitted in the form of **self-certifications** (Presidential Decree no. 445/00) and are subject to checks by the ESU and the Guardia di Finanza.

The family members of students receiving assistance requiring verification of their financial circumstances are placed in the categories subject to the strictest controls (Article 22 of Law No. 390 of 12/02/91).

Pursuant to Article 20 of Law No. 413 of December 30, 1991, checks may also be carried out on data held by credit institutions, including, among other things, accounts and deposits of various kinds.

In the event of "UNTRUE" STATEMENTS, the law provides for the application of administrative, pecuniary and criminal sanctions.

The "untruthfulness" of what was declared exists both in the case in which the student, had he not made the false declaration, would not have obtained any benefit, and in the case in which, had he not made the false declaration, he would still have obtained the benefit, but of a reduced value/amount.

In case the declared data are not true:

- the student loses the benefits received and must return the services used in monetary terms at actual cost.
- imposed an administrative fine of double the amount received and exclusion from competitions for the entire duration of the studies (except, in any case, the application of criminal law for acts constituting a crime).

Random checks will be conducted, in accordance with Legislative Decree no. 109/98, on at least 20% of eligible applicants; these checks may also be conducted after the benefits have been paid.

For the processing of practices related to false declarations, a *reimbursement of administrative costs*, in favor of ESU Venice, equal to €50.00, is foreseen .

5.4 – ASSISTANCE AND INFORMATION - DSU ESU Help Desk at ESU Venice

ATTENTION: For the second phase of the competition (allocation and use of accommodation), the applicant with a SUITABLE result must contact **the ESU Accommodation Office** using the methods indicated in the direct communications sent to the winners of the accommodation place.

The four main steps for correctly completing the online application to participate in the competition for housing services for the 2026/2027 academic year:

STEP 2	Fill in and then press the "Save and Continue" button on the following sections of the Benefits Request application: 1. Payment of Regional Taxes: Declare that you are regularly enrolled (or that you will enroll) in courses for the 2026/2027 academic year and that you have paid (or will pay) the University Contributions and the Regional Tax 2026/2027 3. University Registration: 4. Merit for Subsequent Years (or Maturity Merit if enrolled in the 1st three-year year) 5. Student Condition 6. Choice of benefits 7. Disability condition 8. STEP 3	The last section “Benefits Request – Summary”, you can view all the sections filled out by the requesting student via the drop-down menu. If the data is correct, press the “Save and Continue” button at the bottom right.
STEP 4	After completing “STEP 3”, the “Request” screen will appear. <i>Benefits – Confirmation”.</i> ATTENTION: Only after pressing the “Confirm” button will the “Saving completed. Your data has been successfully saved. Thank you!” screen appear . After a few moments, the student will receive a communication in their registered email inbox with the subject: <i>“Regional benefits application completed.”</i>

7 – INCOME REQUIREMENTS

Students with movable/real estate assets produced exclusively in Italy

To access the benefits provided for the 2026/2027 academic year, all students with assets and income generated in Italy are required to complete a **2026 Single Substitute Declaration (DSU)** to request a **specific ISEE Certificate for the Right to Education (ISEE)** for the student requesting the benefit (it must contain the student's tax code).

The **income limits** of the student's economic conditions, for the 2026/2027 academic year, based on the **ISEU** (University Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) and **ISPEU** indicators (University Equivalent Asset Situation Indicator), are the following:

ISEEU	€ 26.306,25
ISPEU	€ 43.125,94

Exceeding even one of the two values is cause for exclusion.

To obtain the ISEE certificate for the right to university education, contact a **Tax Assistance Center (CAF)**. The service is free of charge for the applicant.

For the calculation of **ISEEU** and **ISPEU**, for the definition of the **family unit on which the calculation is based** and the **equivalence scale coefficient**, as well as for any other aspect relating to the calculation, this notice refers to the **Prime Ministerial Decree of 5 December 2013, no. 159**, "Regulation concerning the revision of the methods of determination and the fields of application of the Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator - ISEE" and to the criteria implementing art. 5 of the Prime Ministerial Decree of 09/04/2001 and arts. 7 and 8 of Legislative Decree no. 68/2012.

Only university ISEE certificates issued **after January 1, 2026**, along with the INPS registration number, will be considered valid for participation in the competition.

ATTENTION: ISEE certificates will not be accepted:

- not valid for the DSU for the applicant;
- containing the annotation of omission and/or discrepancy.

7.1 – "CURRENT ISEE": INCOME CHANGES DUE TO ADVERSE EVENTS

In the event of significant changes in income following adverse events (for example, job loss), the Law gives citizens the option of calculating a **current ISEE** based on their income over the last twelve months.

In this case, for the purposes of calculating the current ISEE, a change in employment status of one family member must be associated with a change in the family's overall income that is 25% greater than the income level identified in the standard ISEE. Before requesting the calculation of the current ISEE, you must already have an standard ISEE certificate indicating the income level indicator, which will be used to verify whether you meet the requirements for calculating the current ISEE.

The current ISEE must be requested by the scholarship and/or housing application deadline.

Since the **"current ISEE" certificate is valid for six months**, it must be valid on the date of application submission. Students wishing to submit a current ISEE must attach a specific request and submit it to ESU by the application deadline. They must attach both relevant certificates issued by INPS, as well as the relevant DSUs, by sending an email to protocollo.esuvenezia@pecveneto.it within the deadline for submitting the complaint relating to the requested benefit.

7.2 - STUDENTS WITH FOREIGN INCOME/ASSETS: "ISEE PARIFICATO"

Pursuant to **Legislative Decree no. 68 of March 29, 2012** (Article 8, paragraph 3), the economic status of foreign students or Italian students residing abroad is defined through the **ISEEU (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator)**, **calculated as the sum of income earned abroad and 20% of assets held abroad**, assessed according to the methods set forth in Article 7, paragraph 7.

The economic condition of foreign students or Italian students residing abroad is defined through the **"ISEE parificato"** (as provided for by the Memorandum of Understanding concluded on 03/06/2015 between the National Association of DSU Bodies ANDISU and the CAF registered in the Register of Tax Assistance Centres for Employees adhering to the National Consultation).

"DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ISEE PARIFICATO – ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027"

For the purposes of accessing the regional housing benefit, non-EU students are considered **non-resident**, regardless of their place of residence in Italy, except if their family unit resides in Italy.

For the purposes of assessing the economic situation of **students recognized as political refugees or stateless persons**, only income earned and assets owned in Italy are taken into account.

7.3 – INDEPENDENT STUDENT, AUTONOMOUS FAMILY UNIT

Students wishing to apply for access to Regional Services as an Autonomous Unit, with non-cohabiting parents, must meet the following two conditions:

residence outside the household of the family of origin, for at least two years with respect to a) the date of submission of the application for enrollment for the first time in each course of study, in accommodation not owned by a member of the family.

The student must indicate the date and in which municipality he or she registered the change of residence.

b) **income from employment or similar tax** declared for at least one year, not less than **€9,000.00 per year**, with reference to a family unit of one person.

To verify the accuracy of the declarations made, the student may be asked to provide a copy of the tax return for the last two calendar years.

Pursuant to Prime Ministerial Decree 159/2013, Article 3, Paragraph 6, students who, as minors, were subject to a measure of removal from their family unit and are currently placed in a community, as well as individuals who are registered as cohabitants pursuant to Prime Ministerial Decree 223/1989, are considered to be separate families.

8 - MERIT REQUIREMENTS

To access the benefits, applicants must meet the following merit requirements as of **August 10, 2026** :

8.1 - USE OF THE BONUS

To meet the minimum merit requirements for each year of the course, students have the option of supplementing the credits actually earned with a special **bonus**.

This tool **can be activated only once during the entire study cycle** and has the exclusive function of filling the missing credit quota, according to the values indicated in the reference table.

Consequently, students will be able to benefit from the bonus only if they have not already used it in previous academic years; if they have already used it only partially, they will be able to apply only the remaining credits available.

8.2 - RESEARCH DOCTORATES

First-year students only meet the income requirement and are required to be admitted to the courses.

Students enrolled in subsequent years must meet the requirements for enrollment in the following year, as set out in the respective academic regulations.

Students receiving a **ministerial** scholarship , or a scholarship provided by another public or private institution, **are not eligible for discounted housing**.

9 – STUDENT WITH DISABILITIES

The ESU of Venice has adopted its own framework program of interventions aimed at promoting the integration of students with disabilities into the university environment (as required by a specific resolution of the Board of Directors).

For the purposes of accessing housing services, students with motor, visual, or hearing disabilities are always considered "out of town" for the purposes of accessing housing services.

In case of motor disabilities, the student is entitled to two companions, instead of one.

Accompanying persons of the students who win the competition are entitled to free canteen and accommodation services.

9.1 - SCHOLARSHIP INTEGRATION

Scholarship recipients with a disability of at least 66% may be awarded a supplementary benefit up to double the value of the scholarship, distinguishing between resident, commuter, and non-resident students, taking into account any available Supplementary Fund reserves and the student's actual needs.

10 – HOUSING SERVICE RANKINGS

The criteria for the formation and ordering of the rankings are as follows:

FIRST YEARS OF THE EU and EXTRA-EU	They are defined in ascending order only on the basis of income requirements, that is, the ISEE or ISEE PARIFICATO (and, if the ISEE is equal, the ISPEU).
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YEARS AFTER THE FIRST	They are defined in descending order based on overall merit requirements. In the event of equal merit, the ranking position is defined in ascending order based on income requirements.
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ESU of Venice formulates separate rankings for the accommodation service according to the methods indicated below, they are defined:

- 1) **first years of all courses:** in order of INCOME based on the student's ISEE
- 2) **Years after the first of all courses:** rankings in order of MERIT, broken down by year of study, with priority given to the number of credits earned (CFU); in the event of equal number of CFU, the weighted average of the grades obtained will be used. In the event of equal merit, the ranking position is determined by the student's ISEE.

Given equal economic requirements, younger age constitutes a preferential qualification.

10.1 - PUBLICATION OF THE HOUSING SERVICE RANKINGS

The HOUSING SERVICE rankings (Provisional and Final) will be published according to the indicated deadlines.

The rankings are made known by publication on the SOL Portal by clicking on the "Ranking Results" button.

The publication of the individual online rankings on the SOL Portal serves as notification to individual participants.

PROVISIONAL RANKING

Candidates who meet the requirements will be placed on the provisional ranking list with one of the following outcomes:

- **"ELIGIBLE"**: if they meet all the required requirements;
- **"NOT SUITABLE"**: if they do not possess the requirements or if anomalies emerge, for example

In fact, among the most common discrepancies in the ISEE certification are:

- ISEE or Single Substitutive Declaration (DSU) data not available in the INPS database;
- DSU not valid for university education right benefits;
- Inserting the DSU protocol number instead of the University ISEE certification, even though the latter has already been processed;
- ISEE certification with non-calculable value;
- Presence of omissions or discrepancies in the certification.

If the applicant is ineligible due to errors on the ISEE, they must promptly visit a CAF (Italian Financial Assistance Center) to verify and correct the information. Correction must be completed within the deadlines set for the publication of the final ranking.

In other cases of ineligibility, it is possible to submit **an APPEAL** through the specific section within the SOL Portal in the period between the publication of the provisional ranking and the publication of the definitive ranking.

PROVISIONAL RANKING AND SPECIAL CASES

1. ELIGIBLE Students: Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first who, after completing the competitive exam, obtain a bachelor's degree in the autumn session and enroll in the first year of a master's degree course for the same academic year, are entitled to the "**continuity of benefit**" principle.

Therefore, the eligibility already achieved is automatically extended to the new enrollment period.

2. INELIGIBLE Students: In accordance with the results and procedures of the competition, applications will not be re-evaluated for candidates who were previously found ineligible for enrollment in years subsequent to the first. Completion of a bachelor's degree and subsequent enrollment in a master's degree program after the publication of the final ranking list does not constitute grounds for reviewing the exclusion or ineligibility decision.

3. ELIGIBLE student, and then NOT ELIGIBLE: In the event that a student in the PROVISIONAL RANKING LIST is found to be "ELIGIBLE" and following the official checks is then found to be "NOT ELIGIBLE", in case of availability of beds, he/she may request the accommodation service through **the NOTICE - EXTRA COMPETITION**, published on the website www.esuvenezia.it

FINAL RANKING

As with the provisional ranking, applicants will be included in the final ranking with the wording "ELIGIBLE" (those who meet the requirements) or "NOT ELIGIBLE" (all other cases).

COMMUNICATIONS ON TRANSFERS AND RENUNCIATIONS DURING THE YEAR

ELIGIBLE candidates who, after submitting their application, find themselves in one of the **exclusion conditions** set out in the call for applications **must promptly notify** the ESU Benefits Office at the following email address: benefici@esuvenezia.it.

Students who **transfer**, **withdraw**, or **renounce** their studies before the end of the academic year for which they received the benefit are specifically required to notify the institution.

PART TWO

ALLOCATION AND USE OF THE ACCOMMODATION

11 – ESU ACCOMMODATION OFFICE

Students receiving accommodation based on the results of this announcement will be assigned a place **by the Accommodation Office**, which is responsible for managing the various aspects of the accommodation assignment period, as described in the second part of this announcement.

The Accommodation Office can be contacted at three front-office locations :

at ESU Venice, Rio Novo Headquarters, 3439/A;

4. at the Campus Mestre Residence – Via Torino

3. *Student help desk* at the Academy of Fine Arts, Incurabili Campus - Zattere.

11.1 – ACCOMMODATION TYPES

The structures and accommodation places are of various types: in **directly managed university residences** or **third-party managers**, in double or single rooms, with or without kitchen, with a greater or lesser presence of common spaces.

ESU promotes housing assignments that balance student needs with the characteristics of the specific facility, taking into account any preferences expressed during the acceptance process. Specifically, available **SINGLE ROOMS** are limited and are automatically assigned based on the following criteria:

- Students with a disability greater than 66% or recognized L104
- Ranking position
- chronological age (approximately 30 years and above);
- academic seniority

11.2 - DURATION OF THE HOUSING BENEFIT (10 MONTHS)

Accommodation is provided for the entire academic year for a maximum of **10 months**, according to the deadlines already indicated in the previous point 5:

The start and end dates of the assignment may vary during the year due to updates to the academic calendar or legislative provisions for emergencies.

In order to optimize management costs, in compliance with current *spending review regulations*, the university residences managed directly by ESU are closed during the end-of-year holidays.

Following these closures, discounts will be granted for the monthly payments (not the consumption portion) of December and January, as shown in the table in ATTACHMENT A – Housing Service Rates.

12 – ACCOMMODATION: ACCEPTANCE AND TAKING POSSESSION

ATTENTION: The beneficiary (ELIGIBLE outcome) is required to accept the accommodation **within 15 days** of the publication of the **provisional ranking (or definitive** in the event that the outcome becomes ELIGIBLE only in the latter).

Acceptance of the Accommodation Service must be made using the appropriate form on the **SOL PORTAL**.

If the beneficiary **does not take possession** of the accommodation without justified reasons (formally communicated to protocollo.esuvenezia@pecveneto.it), **within 15 days of the accommodation being made available**, the right to the benefit will lapse.

When submitting the online application, residents read and accept without reservation the **Housing Service Regulations** and the **Security Regulations**.

12.1 - PARTICIPATION IN CONFERENCES ON SAFETY AND PREVENTION

As required by **Legislative Decree no. 81/08 (Consolidated Law on Health and Safety at Work)**, the Venice ESU organizes informational and training conferences during the academic year on safety and evacuation procedures. **Residents are required to attend these conferences, under penalty of forfeiture of their right to the Accommodation Service**. The attendance register for each individual course participant will be used as proof.

The student staying in the residence actively participates in the supervision of the facility, in terms of safety, promptly informing the relevant figures: the residence manager, the student tutor, the control room, and the security service, as per the instructions posted in all facilities.

13 – PAYMENT METHODS

Information on payments due for housing services: fees, security deposit, utilities, and tourist tax.

13.1 – SECURITY DEPOSIT

In order to benefit from the accommodation service, the assigned student must:

1. pay the **SECURITY DEPOSIT of 300.00 euros** via electronic payment PagoPA2
on the personal page of the SOL PORTAL, the student regularizes payments through individual "IUV" payments present in the SOL PORTAL in the "PagoPA Payments" section;
2. **by the 5th of the month of arrival**, or as otherwise indicated in the case of accommodation with a **non-ESU manager**, the first month's rent must be paid as per the following schedule:

13.2 - ACCOMMODATION RATES AND COSTS

Rates are valid for the period of assignment, excluding periods of suspension of academic activity corresponding to the end-of-year holidays.

The complete list of rates and costs is shown in the table ATTACHMENT A – Housing Service Rates.

Third-party providers may request inflation adjustments before the start of the academic year. Should any changes occur, ESU will update the fee schedule with a specific provision.

During the end-of-year holiday season and during the summer break, the accommodation service is suspended.

² To settle amounts owed to ESU VENEZIA, we use exclusively the Public Administration's electronic payment system (Pago PA), which allows students to make any payment to public administrations electronically. Students can make any payment to ESU through a simple and immediate procedure, obtaining the relevant reconciliation quickly, automatically, and securely.

Discounts are available for December and January; see APPENDIX A – Accommodation Service Rates. **Discounts are only available for properties that are closed.**

Students who are unable to return to their home country and request accommodation for the Christmas period must indicate this when submitting their online application.

13.3 SUMMER ACCOMMODATION OR EXAM ACCOMMODATION

Subject to availability of places and facilities, students whose applications are accepted will be housed in university residences. The exact location will be communicated closer to the start of their stay.

1. **Summer Accommodation (July – August):** reserved exclusively for students who have already received ESU accommodation during the current academic year.
2. **Extra-assignment accommodation (for session exams):** accessible to:
 - o Students who have already received ESU accommodation during the academic year;
 - o New applicants who meet the requirements for pre-assignment of the competition;
 - o Other categories of students.

The service is subject to advance payment of the entire fee for the requested period. RATE E (Extra-Competition) applies, details of which can be found in Appendix A – Accommodation Service Rates.

The application must be submitted exclusively online at www.esuvenezia.it, respecting the following deadlines:

- By April 30, 2027 for summer accommodation.
- By July 31, 2027 for extra-assignment accommodation.

13.4 - PAYMENT METHODS FOR ACCOMMODATION

REGIONAL SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

1. Students may be awarded a scholarship in December, for the first time, or during the year, for a second time, depending on available resources. The payment schedule refers to the possible award of the scholarship and the various options that may arise.
2. The accommodation is assigned for 10 months: in case of early withdrawal, the refund of the portion of the scholarship intended for the unused accommodation service is not foreseen, except in particular situations, assessed by the Accommodation Office and the Benefits Office in each case.

3. Payments must be made within the deadlines communicated by the Accommodation Office, **exclusively by electronic payment PagoPA – by accessing the personal page of the SOL Portal, “PagoPA Payments” section.**
4. The accommodation balance will be recalculated and updated even if the student is awarded a scholarship at a later time after the end of the period.

³ In accordance with the General Regulations of University Residences, acceptance of accommodation entails the obligation to respect the rooms and common areas. Transferring, subleasing, or leasing accommodation to third parties is strictly prohibited. The accommodation must be vacated by 10:00 a.m. on the last day of your stay, without exception.

assignment; the beneficiary will, consequently, be required to proceed with the payment of the amount due.

5. The scholarship fee is applied retroactively for the entire period of stay, so updated calculations are also made for monthly fees already paid.

PAYMENT METHODS: STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE REGIONAL SCHOLARSHIP WHO OPT FOR ANOTHER BAG

For this type of user, the rates for the services are:

- ACCOMMODATION SERVICE – RATE B – Scholarship holder;
- RESTAURANT SERVICE – RATE B (Full meal €4.70 - Reduced meal €3.70).

The reduced rate does not apply to students receiving any scholarship other than a regional one awarded for any reason.

STUDENTS IN INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY

Students assigned accommodations for International Mobility and those who do not win the competition will be charged the **monthly rate** (see APPENDIX A – Housing Service Fees). In the event of early withdrawal, the unused portion will not be refunded.

RESEARCH DOCTORS (NON-MINISTERIAL)

PhD students who win the competition can use the accommodation for short periods instead of the normal terms (assignment for 10 months) at the daily rate (see APPENDIX A – Housing Service Rates).

13.5 - TOURIST TAX

If applicable, students must make the electronic PagoPa payment from the SOL portal, in the "PagoPa Payments" section.

13.6 – CONSUMPTION, REPAIR COSTS AND OTHER SERVICES

The fee includes utilities (water, electricity, air conditioning) and maintenance costs. If, upon inspection, ESU finds consumption levels exceeding normal standards, it may charge residents for the additional costs.

Note: Consumption fee at the Crociferi-COMBO residence: The user's consumption fee is a flat rate. Management of the Crociferi-Combo residence periodically sends billing statements.

REPAIRS/REPLACEMENTS

The list of related costs is attached to the "*Housing Service Regulations*" available on www.esuvenezia.it; The costs will be charged and communicated via email to the student who requests assistance or following the interventions carried out by the office for maintenance deemed necessary, directly on the payment slip and integrated into the balance due at the end of the assignment period.

COSTS FOR ANY ADDITIONAL SERVICES: LINEN SUPPLY, FINAL ROOM CLEANING

They will be communicated via email and charged, to the student who requests them, directly to the payment slip and integrated into the balance due at the end of the assignment period.

The rooms will be inspected monthly to monitor:

- the state of maintenance of the premises; extraordinary cleaning may be arranged with charges to the assignees, after notification to the interested parties;
- the use of bed linen (in case of lack, it will be provided by ESU and will be imputed the cost).

Each guest is charged a flat fee of **€70.00** for final cleaning, management checks, supply and maintenance of linens, and minor maintenance. This fee is charged at the end of the stay (and, if applicable, upon request for a room change).

13.7 SUSTAINABILITY: ENERGY CONSUMPTION REDUCTION AND WASTE COLLECTION

The Company offers initiatives aimed at raising awareness, informing, and training users of university canteens and residences to improve energy efficiency and manage separate waste collection.

Taking responsibility for energy use and managing separate waste collection has significant repercussions on cost containment, both individual and collective, and on the protection of collective environmental resources.

14 - STUDENT COLLABORATIONS

Pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29/03/2012, ESU Venice may identify, among students eligible for regional benefits, students to carry out targeted student collaboration activities, distinguished between:

- ESU university residence tutoring service
- Informational tutoring service for incoming orientation for students enrolled at the Academy of Fine Arts
- support to administrative offices dedicated to managing DSU services

Each selection process begins with the publication of a NOTICE addressed to all students of Venetian universities, detailing the procedures, deadlines, and conditions.

15 – REFERENCE TO THE GENERAL RULES OF THE PLAN ANNUAL REGIONAL FOR THE DSU

ESU Ardsu di Venezia (hereinafter "ESU" or "the Administration"), the data controller, in carrying out its activities, pays the utmost attention to the security and confidentiality of the personal data of the interested parties who request and use the services provided by ESU (hereinafter also the "Students") through the website www.esuvenezia.it (hereinafter the "ESU Website").

What personal data can be collected

ESU may collect the following categories of personal data, also jointly referred to as Personal Data, concerning you:

- **Contact details** – information relating to personal details (name, surname, date and place of birth, address, and tax code) and contact details (telephone number, mobile number, email address, and identity document number);
- **Contact information** – information relating to your citizenship and residence;
- **Identification document data** – information relating to the identification document issued;
- **Profile data** – information relating to the academic call for applications you intend to participate in;
- **University enrollment data** – information relating to academic progress (such as university, faculty, degree program, student ID number) as well as information relating to merit (such as number of credits earned);
- **Student status data** – information relating to the status of a non-resident student;
- **Economic data** – information relating to the economic situation including the ISEE DSU certification and relating to the status of regional tax payments;
- **Site Usage** – information about how you use the site, open or forward our communications, including information collected through cookies (you can find our Cookie Policy on the ESU Website).

In order to provide some of the services offered, ESU may also collect certain data classified as "Special Categories of Personal Data" pursuant to Article 9 of the GDPR, specifically data relating to your disability, its degree, and any food intolerances and allergies relevant to the catering service. How we collect your data

For what purposes can your personal data be used?

ESU processes your data in relation to the services offered through the site, exclusively for the purposes that fall within the institutional duties of the Administration, as described below.

- b. **Purpose of providing additional services related to the DSU**, such as catering, study and career guidance, psychological counseling, tutoring, and the promotion of cultural activities and international student exchanges. The basis for processing your data for both the purposes described above (a) and (b) is the performance of a task in the public interest. Your consent will not be required for any processing of Special Categories of Personal Data concerning you, pursuant to Art. 9, paragraph 2, letter g) of the GDPR. Providing your data for these purposes is necessary to process your request; otherwise, we will not be able to process it.
- c. **Compliance with legally binding requests to fulfill a legal obligation, regulations, or orders from judicial authorities, as well as to defend a right in court**. ESU may also process your data to fulfill a legal obligation and/or to defend its rights in court. Legal basis for processing: fulfillment of a legal obligation.

How we keep your personal data safe

ESU uses a wide range of security measures to enhance the protection and maintenance of the security, integrity, and accessibility of your data. All your data is stored on our secure servers or in secure paper copies, or on those of our suppliers or business partners, and can be accessed and used in accordance with our security standards and policies (or equivalent standards for our suppliers or business partners).

How long do we keep your data?

We retain your data only for the purposes for which it was collected or for any other related legitimate purpose. Therefore, if your data is processed for two different purposes, we will retain it until the purpose with the longest retention period ceases. However, we will no longer process your data for the purpose whose retention period has expired. Specifically, your data will be retained for 10 years after your Student status ceases. We limit access to your data.

Only to those who need to use it for relevant purposes. Your data that is no longer necessary, or for which there is no longer a legal basis for its retention, is irreversibly anonymized (and can thus be retained) or securely destroyed.

Who we can share your data with

Your data may be accessed by duly authorised employees, as well as external suppliers, appointed, if necessary, Data controllers, who provide support for the provision of services, including, in particular, Sarca Catering srl, which provides catering services. Furthermore, your data may be disclosed, within the scope of the Administration's institutional activities, to the University to which you are enrolled, as well as to other public bodies, such as the Police Headquarters. Your data protection rights and your right to lodge complaints with the supervisory authority

Under certain conditions you have the right to ask us:

- access to your personal data;
- the rectification of the data in our possession;
- the deletion of any data for which we no longer have any legal basis for processing;
- opposition to the processing where provided for by applicable legislation;
- the limitation of how we process your personal data, within the limits established by the legislation on the protection of personal data.

The exercise of these rights is subject to certain exceptions aimed at safeguarding the public interest (for example, the prevention or identification of crimes) and our interests.

If you exercise any of the above rights, we will verify your legal standing and will respond to you, generally within one month. We will make every effort to respond to any complaints or reports regarding how we process your data. However, if you wish, you may forward your complaints or reports to the data protection authority (Italian Data Protection Authority), using the contact details available at www.garanteprivacy.it.
